DAVID	1/ TIR PRINCE PARK - There are 2 in Towyn, the recognised Bio Diversity Area at the southern boundary of the park and the 2 meadows at the north and eastern edges of the park both of which have not been mowed for a number of years and as such have slowly increasing numbers of wild flowers.
KAY	1/ CHESTER AVENUE AREA - I can't see there is really anywhere we could cut back. Most is cut by Cartrefi. The park is quite small, and well used by locals and Conwy Ffit play workers. I guess there is the patch at the end of Chester Avenue alongside St Asaph avenue that would look nice with wild flowers. I would say that if areas are going to be left, we consider the wild flower seeds to make it bio-diverse and more attractive than just 'uncut grass.' Anywhere directly in front of the houses, i think that we have a duty to cut and maintain.
KAY	2/ ST ASAPH AVENUE - Possibly some of the patches on St Asaph Avenue near Tir Llywd, but would need to consider where bulb planting has taken place.
