

Feedback from residents following Social Media post regarding Ffordd Y Berllan Field.

Resident one	The resident expresses concern over the proposed plan to divide the recreational land off Ffordd y Berllan into separate areas for dog walking and children's play. Although initially supportive in principle, they now question the financial implications—reportedly between £10,000 and £20,000—and feel the funds could be better spent elsewhere. They highlight a lack of adequate consultation, particularly for residents not on social media, and note that most neighbours on Lon Eirin are unaware of the proposal. They and their husband do not support the proposed changes and challenge the validity of the small sample of public opinion cited (20 in favour, 8 against, 4 unsure), suggesting a letter be sent to nearby residents, a poll added to the council social media/website, and councillors engage directly with elderly residents. The resident also shares their long-term use of the space for both children and dogs without any issue, suggesting the current shared use works well and may not require intervention.
Resident two	The resident raises concerns about the proposal to divide the green space at Parc Y Castell into separate areas for dog walkers and children, following a reported incident of dog fouling near the football goal. While acknowledging the issue, they believe the proposal is a disproportionate response to an isolated event. As a nearby resident, dog owner, and grandparent, they regularly use the park for both purposes and have not experienced conflicts. They feel the segregation plan is unnecessary, not widely supported by locals, and lacks adequate community consultation. The individual also notes that posted plans have been removed and expresses concern over the cost, stating that limited council funds could be better spent on more pressing community needs. They urge councillors to reconsider the proposal and conduct broader engagement with local residents before proceeding.
Resident three	The resident objects to the proposed changes to the public park, expressing concern over the plan to install fenced, segregated areas. They value the park as a shared, open space enjoyed by all members of the community and believe the changes would negatively impact its openness and character. They highlight existing local opposition, including online discussions, and argue that the proposed spending could be better directed toward more pressing needs, such as installing street lighting to improve safety in winter. The resident urges the council to reconsider the plans and engage with regular users of the park, noting that the space may have originally been gifted to the community.
