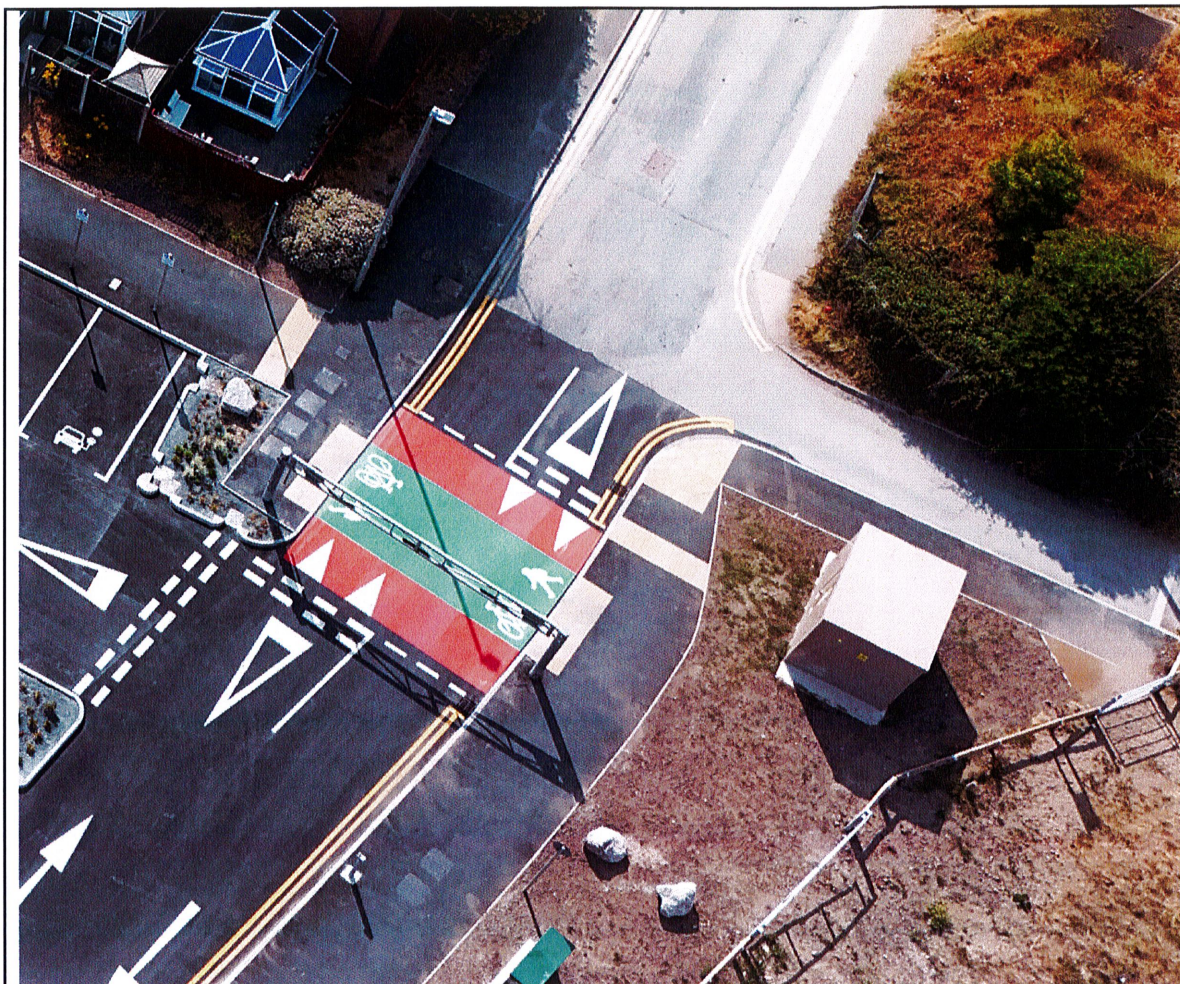

Good Afternoon Dylan,

Apologise in delay in emailing you back. I was on annual leave yesterday. I have summarised below responses to your queries/comments raised in email sent 20th July.

Unauthorised access to car park (avoiding Height barrier)

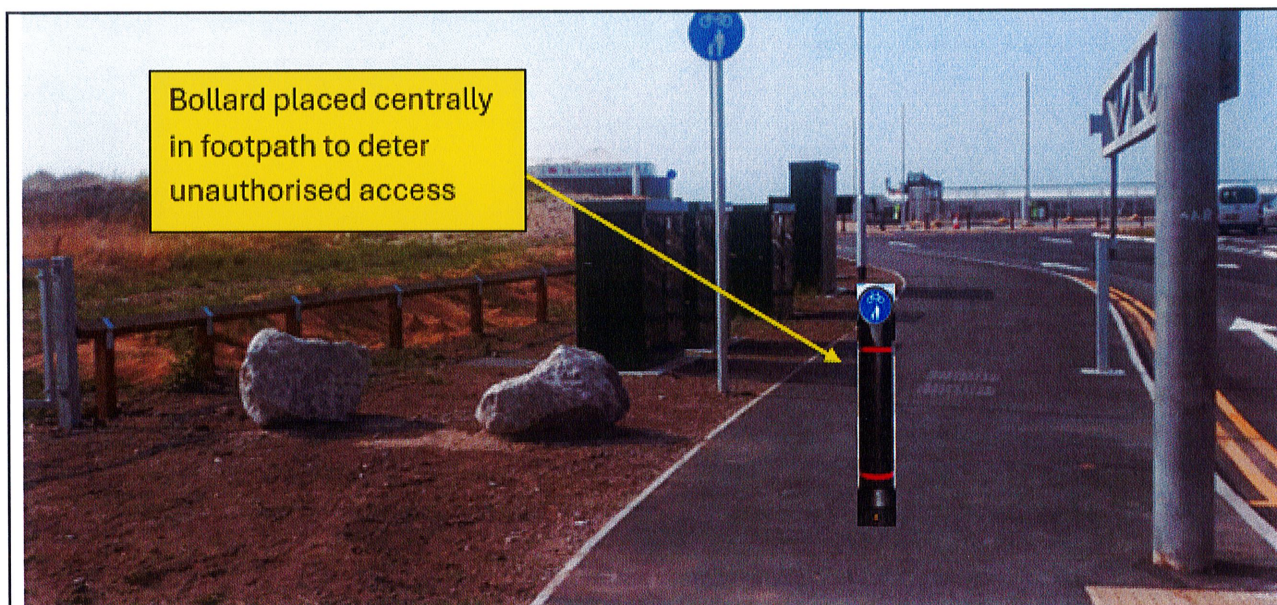
Following our site walkover on the 1st July with yourselves, it was identified that the car park required further measures to deter unauthorised access by larger vehicles. This was due to the town council expressing concerns having previous experience of this being an issue. We were able to arrange very promptly the installation of large rock boulders in the verge either side of the height barrier within a couple of days of the meeting and before the car park was opened to the public. In the walkover, it was also identified that it would be prudent, given the past experiences learnt by the Town council, that further preventative measures in the form of bollards be added to the pavement to deter motorist mounting the kerb and driving around the height barrier to gain access to the car park. Its unfortunate that measures such as these are required and necessary. The path width is deliberately wider @ 3m, to comply with shared use/active travel requirements. We have ordered the bollards and pending delivery anticipated this week, we will install these on the footpath in locations shown below.

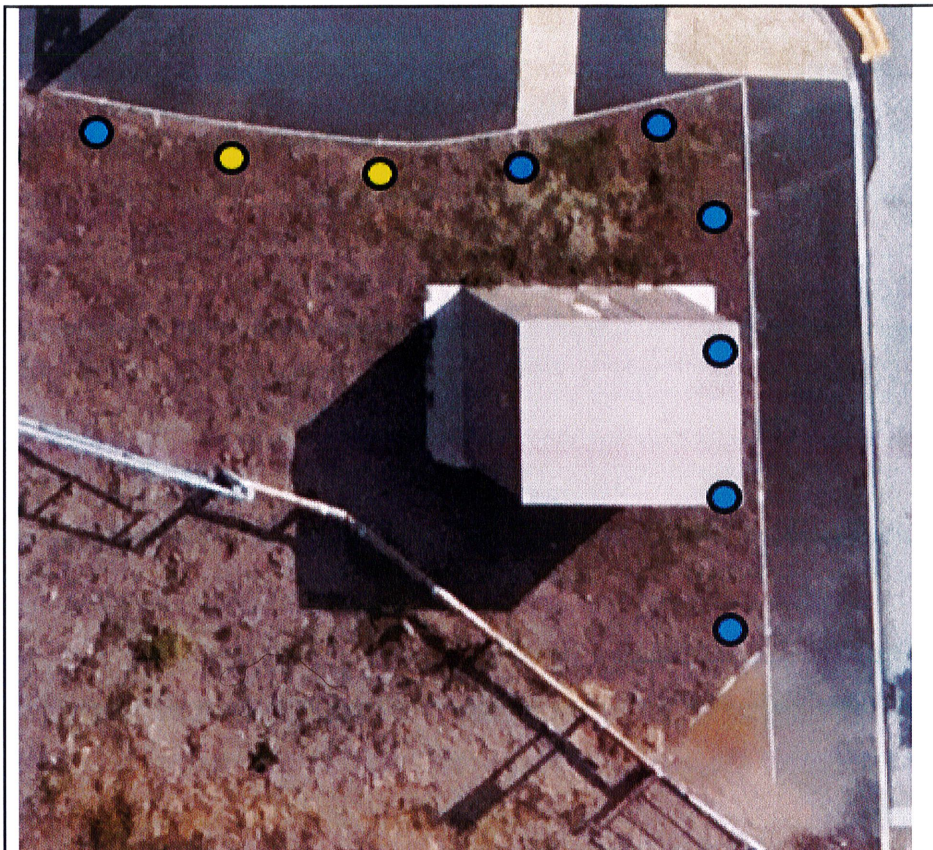


Bollard placed centrally

Unauthorised parking on verge outside car park

It wasn't identified in the town council walkover on the 1st July, however following illegal parking on the grass verge in front of the maintenance access gate into the nature reserve outside the car park, we have ordered some bollards for installation on the verge to deter this from happening. Pending delivery this week, our contractor will install at the earliest opportunity.

Padlock box

Concerns are noted regarding padlock to height barrier. The locking mechanism hasn't changed and has been the same type and method for securing the height barrier that was in place pre-scheme.
