Good Afternoon,

My email is in reference to the planned resurfacing of St. Asaph Avenue in Kinmel Bay starting on the 15th January 2024.

I believe my elected members (County Councillors) have indicated to your departments that they would like to see all the mini roundabouts removed and not reinstated after the completion of the resurfacing works.

My view and that of many residents of Clwyd Park and the Anwl Estate that this should not happen.

Without these mini roundabouts the difficulty in joining St. Asaph Avenue from these junctions is going to be significantly more challenging this road has become the main artery into Kinmel Bay, Towyn and Rhyl with Heavy goods vehicles and holiday traffic.

I have been a resident of Clwyd Park for over 40 years and the volume of traffic passing across the main exit from these estates

Is significant and without the roundabouts stopping traffic to allow safe joining I feel there could be more RTA's.

I feel there was no public consultation or advanced notice that our local elected members had given there backing to not to reinstate the mini roundabouts after resurfacing work.

I would request as a Local Resident that at least 2 of the 4 mini roundabouts are kept Clwyd Park & the Anwl Estate.

I would like to hear your response and thoughts prior to the work commencing.
