Steel Shipping Container

The members at the Full Town Council meeting held on Wednesday 24th January, 2024, as part of Agenda Item 11 – Conwy CBC Biodiversity & Resilience of ECO Systems Delivery Plan, discussed the unlocked steel shipping container in the St Asaph Avenue Sports Field, which they believe has been subject to anti-social behaviour and arson in recent years.

Would the trustees consider removing the rusty container from the field, and if the charity don't have funds available, the Town Council would potentially be prepared to cover the cost of removing the container.

11. Conwy CBC Biodiversity and Resilience of ECO System Delivery Plan

Noted the following locations which have been identified by members in the Towyn and Kinmel Bay area, for potential Conwy CBC projects: -

- Tir Prince Park
- Chester Avenue
- St Asaph Avenue Grass Verges
- St Asaph Avenue Playing Field
- Parc Hanes
- Coal Yard at the back of St Mary's Church

Noted that Conwy CBC have confirmed that they have identified/secured grant funding for a Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystem Project in Tir Prince Park.

Noted that Conwy CBC have arranged two site meetings at the park between Conwy CBC Officers and potential contractors on 29/01/2024, and 19/02/2024, and that Conwy CBC have confirmed that Conwy CBC members and TKBTC members are welcome to attend the meetings.

Noted the Conwy CBC Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystems Duty Delivery Plan and 2019 Report.

Cllr D Johnson advised that he has visited the playing field on St Asaph Avenue recently and he was disappointed with the Biodiversity at both the field and the Tiny Forest, and he feels that the rusty steel shipping container is unsightly.

Cllr N Smith advised that the unlocked steel container has been subject to anti-social behaviour and a number of fires.

Resolved that: - The Clerk writes to the Charity to ask if they would consider removing the container, and if the Charity don't have funds available to remove it, the Town Council would potentially be prepared to cover all/part of the costs to remove the container.

12. Speed Sensing Signs

Noted that there has been a saving of £2,491 relating to the two recently installed Speed Sensing Signs (Foryd Road and Towyn Road).

Resolved that: - A Speed Sensing Sign would not be installed/considered for Chester Avenue, at this time.

13. TKBTC Bus Shelters

Noted that Conwy CBC have finally confirmed that the 5 bus shelters are owned by Conwy CBC, and not the Town Council.

Noted that the Clerk has now removed the 5 shelters from the Town Council's Asset Register and Insurance Policy.

Noted that the Clerk is still awaiting Conwy CBC to reply regarding the three proposed additional bus shelters on Towyn Road.

Resolved that: - The 6m Internal Bus Shelter Survey will continue to be completed (Previously completed for Insurance Purposes) so that we can ensure that the shelters continue to be maintained/cleaned by Conwy CBC.

14. Conwy CBC CCTV Consultation

Noted the Conwy CBC Consultation relating to the re-deployable public space CCTV Cameras.
